- 16. What powers does the State Auditor have? Establishes appropriate systems of accounting for all public officials of state, audit accounts and the treasury
- 17. List the qualifications of the State Auditor. 30 years old, 15 year citizen, 10 year resident
- 18. What are the limitations of the State Auditor? No duty shall be placed on him by law not related to his duties
- 19. What powers does the Secretary of State hold? Custodian of the seal of the state; authenticate all official acts of governor; custodian of records
- 20. What is the main duty of the Secretary of State? "Great Seal of the State of Missouri"
- 21. What is the limitation of the Secretary of State? Cannot authenticate approval of laws by governor
- 22. What is the main duty of the State Treasurer? Custodian of all state funds and funds received from the federal government
- 23. What limitations does the State Treasurer have? Acts must be approved by governor and state government
